





Let's cover up!

Science activity


Connect each animal to the type of outer covering it has.




feathers


Let's cover up!

Science exploration

The child learns that different animals have different body coverings. Help the child cover the styrofoam balls. The child should see that the toothpick ball's covering acts as protection. Ask the child if he or she can name an animal with a prickly covering.
